SESSION: Revenue Opportunities: Getting Every Penny from QRP, VBP and 5-Star

SUMMARY: Skilled Nursing Facility Value Based Purchasing (SNF VBP), SNF Quality Reporting Programs (QRP), and CMS's Five-Star Rating System offer opportunities for providers to increase revenue. Incentive payments, increased marketability against competitors, and improved census are all possible. Learn how to translate the quality care you provide to your residents, into positive outcomes under these programs.

This session will also explore how recent changes included in the FY 2024 Final Rule for Skilled Nursing Facilities (SNF) Prospective Payment System (PPS) will impact provider's quality and value programs for years to come.

Resources to develop the type of care and service needed to address issues of mental disorders, substance use, addictions, and other behavioral health needs are in short supply. This session offers a variety of ideas for anticipating and developing common sense approaches to these contemporary challenges. Improving staff education and training in behavioral health and developing strategies to address common symptoms and reactions in mental health are a focus of this conversation.

Award-wining author and presenter Lee Silber brings the topic of turnover management to



life and includes relevant examples of how the "Next Person Up" philosophy is successfully used in entertainment, sports, and business while also offering industry-specific insights and ideas Health Care Administrators can implement.

OBJECTIVES:

- Use the power of mentorship to train, maintain, and monitor new and younger workers to help them learn the ropes, manage the stress, and get up to speed faster.
- Create playbooks for each position, project, and procedure—shown in a step-by-step format. (Video playbooks will be covered as well.)
- How to start playing the "What if?" game and create alternative plans for worst-

case scenarios to help us cover all (most) contingencies. This includes creating depth charts to see who can cover what if someone is out sick or on vacation, and which positions need back ups.

- Three simple ways to make leading by example a priority.
- Why offering opportunities for employees to learn new skills not only helps them grow, but also makes them more versatile.
- How to use technology to share the big picture and what the "why" is of what you do so your people feel a part of the team and are reminded their work makes a difference.

This session will include a detailed discussion of recent developments in the Nursing Home operating environment, including Medicaid reimbursement, minimum staffing requirements, and the "70/40/5" rules.
